#### 74 PRIME CATTLE/3 CULL COWS

A very good level of demand once again with buyers commenting on the tremendous cattle that were shown by our regular producers this morning. Best butcher's cattle with trade possibly in front of the Christmas sale last week, with stronger breaking cattle easy to sell at the moment.

Decent steer numbers sold to a high of 336p/kg or £2023 in the lump, with 4 bullocks 300p/kg plus.

A buoyant heifer market saw a high of 358p/kg or £2026 as a whole, with 22 females selling to 304p/kg or above.

Disappointing bull numbers with quality lacking today selling to a top of 260p/kg, with buyers looking for good quality, well-finished bulls, with weight no object. More needed every Tuesday please.

Three cull cows forward, all non-assured, sold to 140p/kg for a pretty fat Devon cow at 880kg.

#### 19 STEERS SOLD TO OV AV 277P/KG

Young Dan Rodenhurst was in charge today and will likely get the job again, with his Limmie steer 602kg selling to 336p/kg or £2022.72. A useful one of ten from Mrs B topped at 328p/kg for Blue x Angus at 588kg, with her Blonde selling to 308p/kg for 592kg. Andrew Preece's homebred Limousins sold easily to 312p/kg for 628kg. Very fit Angus steers from the Kennerley farm well worth a mention at 285p/kg for 664kg.
