An absolutely blistering trade producing a record high for a normal Tuesday sale of 380p/kg. Many more steers, heifers and bulls could have sold to advantage today, with all meated cattle meeting fierce competition. Several buyers have asked me to find a few more cattle for next week, so please book your cattle with Mark Burgoyne by next Monday before 7.00pm.

Only a small compliment of steers saw a sharp trade without any best sorts forward and sold to a high of 294p/kg or £1732 in the lump.

A supersonic result in the heifer department with some cracking heifers to go at! Handy 522kg sold to a record 380p/kg with 26 females realising 300p/kg or above. Heifers sold to a high of £2016 for 560kg.

Disappointing bull numbers saw a decent go selling to a top of 286p/kg or £1913 in the lump. Many more well finished bulls were required to satisfy demand.

9 cull cows saw trade more difficult with this section the only one to benefit from farm assurance. 5 year old Angus cows sold to 190p/kg for 782kg or £1486, with older Angus to 150p/kg for 758kg.

'Mrs B' sold her Angus cross at 584kg to 294p/kg to head the day here, with her Simmental cross to 282p/kg for 614kg. 578kg Blues sold to 262p/kg from the Tolley family. **MORE STEERS NEEDED EACH WEEK**.

46 HEIFERS SOLD TO OV. AV. 298P/KG

The averages say it all! A super run from Evans Curdale sailed to that record 380p/kg for 522kg with others to 360p/kg or £2016. The Parkes family sold their best to 358p/kg for 552kg. Other notable prices were Tony Barkers' Limmie storming to 334p/kg for 588kg and 'Mrs B' selling her 600kg black Limmie to 330p/kg (£1980).

16 BULLS SOLD TO OV. AV. 258P/KG

Some tidy bulls here and these saw a high of 286p/kg for 630kg Limousin from Dan Watkins, with 634kg from Ben Rochelle realising 283p/kg. 688kg Limousin crosses from Dave Preece added up well at £1912.64. Plenty of bulls well over 16 months selling well without a hitch.
