No let up in trade at Bridgnorth today with many Monday centres seeing easier markets. Wholesaling cattle were possibly dearer than last Tuesday's flier and best butcher's cattle easily holding their own.

A few more steers penned this morning saw a top of 320p/kg on two occasions or £2080 in the lump. Strong demand on well-finished sorts.

Handyweight heifers topped the day at 364p/kg with less of these forward. Stronger females met an exceptional trade selling to £2116.

Bull numbers were lacking once again and made regular orders difficult to fulfil, Angus cross bulls topped at 275p/kg on two occasions to £1820 in the lump.
