The unseasonably good weather kept farmers in the fields and so numbers were tight in all markets yesterday and today. A tidy trade resulted with best butcher's cattle seeing similar values and more commercial sorts saw a step-up in trade. Needless to say, more well-finished cattle, whatever they were – big or small, assured or not – would have sold to advantage.

An extremely small entry of steers were largely over 40 months and sold to 274p/kg or £1781 in the lump. Some decent heifers penned this morning sold to a high of 354p/kg or £2020 in the lump. 19 heifers out of 35 sold at 300p/kg or above!

Best bulls with meat were the order of the day with heavy Limmies to 294p/kg or £2209 in the lump. Plainer, underfinished bulls met a slower trade.

One non-assured Limousin stock bull sold to 150p/kg for 946kg (£1419) with a non FABBL Limousin cow (18 years) to 140p/kg for 658kg (£921).

ONLY 38 CLEAN CATTLE FORWARD 3 STEERS SOLD TO OV. AV. 242P/KG

Saler-cross steers 650kg from David Preece topped our small entry at 274p/kg (£1781) with Phil Edwards selling his 41-month Charolais cross to 228p/kg for 676kg.

35 HEIFERS SOLD TO OV. AV. 294P/KG

A very useful run from Roger Jordin took the gold medal slot at 354p/kg for 532kg, with his 614kg Limmie to 329p/kg or £2020.06 in the lump. Evans Curdale set the wheels turning with their 588kg Limo hitting 331p/kg (£1946.28) with a second to 328p/kg for 562kg. Harvey Parkes sold his usual quality to 330p/kg for 528kg.

25 BULLS SOLD TO OV. AV. 235P/KG

Some great Limousins from John Hewitt sold nicely to 294p/kg for 680kg with his 708kg stormer to 290p/kg (£2053.20). A stunning pair from the Kirton family topped the headage stakes at £2209.80 for 762kg (290p/kg) with his lighter bull to 286p/kg. 814kg Limmies sold to £1986.16 from Dave Jones. Friesians were quite plain and sold to 200p/kg for 532kg from David Preece
