#### **107 PRIME CATTLE/7 CULL COWS/BULLS**

Following last week's flier more cattle came forward this morning – there were above 100 head penned for the first time for many weeks. A firm trade from start to finish, with well-finished sorts in strongest demand. There were several cattle sold before their time, which were too lean and would depress overall averages.

A few more steers saw a 32-month steer selling to 292 p/kg with a top price per head of £1796.

Some very good runs of heifers forward but perhaps not quite the cream of the last sale. A top pence per kilo of 346 was realised with heavy females to  $\pm 2077$  in the lump.

Bull numbers were tight again with one main order failing to get going. Heavy Continentals sold to a reputable 290p/kg, with others to £2100 and £2089 in the lump. No black and white bulls forward.

Six cull cows and 1 stock bull saw all the cows non-assured and selling to a high of 138p/kg for 760kg Limousin crosses and hard-worked Angus stock bulls to 110p/kg for 900kg.

#### 90 CLEAN CATTLE FORWARD 14 STEERS SOLD TO OV. AV. 242P/KG

A shapey Simmental cross steer from Mrs B sold nicely to 292p/kg, having slipped past its 30m birthday! Will Rodenhurst saw his 630kg Limmie cross selling to 285p/kg. Andrew Millichamp's Blondes topped at 274p/kg. Very lean steers harder to place.


#### 76 HEIFERS SOLD TO OV. AV. 285P/KG



As last week, quality lambs purchased by Bridgnorth butchers – Rob Arbuckle - this week a superb pen of Beltex lambs from George Evans 44kg at 312p/kg.

Heavier lambs to 288p/kg for 46kg from Stuart Moss and 261p/kg for 54kg, selling to £147.90 for 60kg from Wayne Brown.

Lambs under 40kg to 270p/kg for 38.5kg from Josh Munday. A large number of Welsh hill lambs 28kg to 34kg, sold to 230p/kg. With lighter, lean, under-finished sheep a tricky trade.
