A handful more clean cattle forward, coupled with less bulls met an easier trade with the overall average below 400p/kg for the first time for a while, the shorter week probably hindering trade. There were definitely more heavier, commercial types penned today with best sorts still selling well with 15 cattle selling to 440p/kg and above.

A very small show of steers saw a high of 428p/kg with heavier Herefords to £2748 in the lump.

Best butchers' heifers topped at 470p/kg with heavier females just short of £3000 at £2975.

No suckler bred bulls forward saw Angus crosses selling to 400p/kg or £2808 in the lump.

Two cows sold to 250p/kg for British Blue cross cows at 792kg with non-assured Devon cows to £2132.48 for 896kg.

On the 11th March 2025 the Rural Payments Agency announced that the Sustainable Farming Incentive scheme was closed for new applications with immediate effect. Those with existing SFI schemes will not be affected, and those with applications already submitted should still be offered an agreement, however going forward no new applications can be submitted. A reformed SFI scheme is set to be announced in the summer, but at this stage we are unsure of the exact timing or form of the scheme, but will keep you informed.
