Clean cattle numbers continue to be tight but with a decent bull entry forward this morning, the buyers set sail and trade was sharp. There were some very well-fleshed cattle penned, with just a sprinkling of leaner types depleting averages.

Very few steers saw the best available selling to 296p/kg with £1914 top price per head. More steers were required to satisfy demand.

Most best butchers' cattle were well above 520kg today selling to a high of 349p/kg with not necessarily the biggest selling above £1900 in the lump. 24 heifers sold to or above 300p/kg.

A decent bull entry with some quality types entered saw a good trade with Continentals to 290p/kg or £2128 in the lump. 30 plus bulls required every Tuesday.

2 cull cows and 1 stock bull forward. Assured aged Limousin cows sold to 130p/kg for 774kg with Limousin stock bulls to 140p/kg for 886kg.

53 CLEAN CATTLE FORWARD

4 STEERS SOLD TO OV. AV. 277P/KG

638kg red Limousins from Andrew Carter sailed to 296p/kg to head this department with 35-month Limmies from David Preece selling to 286p/kg for 654kg. 714kg Limousin steers from Andrew Preece sold to £1913.52.

49 HEIFERS SOLD TO OV. AV. 284P/KG

8 storming red Limousin heifers from Evans Curdale topped at 349p/kg with 3 others 340p/kg or more and the lot averaging 334p/kg! A half-tonner from the Kirton family was not outshone at 343p/kg. Harvey Parkes sold his best to 322p/kg. More heifers could have been sold to advantage today.

29 BULLS SOLD TO OV. AV. 251P/KG

A super run from Georgia Delves of fit Limmies topped this department at 290p/kg for 734kg (£2128.60), with her second to 288p/kg for the same weight. 692kg red Lims from Evans Curdale also sold to 288p/kg. Angus and Limousins from David Jones also sold to £2081 and £2013. Friesian bulls sold to 220p/kg for 580kg from Charlie Lloyd.

Heavier lambs from Rob Jones at 48.5kg to 290p/kg and £141 and a top price per head of £147 for Suffolk lambs from Tony Davies. Lambs under 40kg to 276p/kg from Steve Lewis and more hill breeds to 265p/kg from Darren Jordan.

The overall average would be a poor reflection of trade due to the varied quality of lambs on offer.
