

No big entry of lambs for this year's fat stock show and sale, however 25 single lambs forward for the Brian Meredith cup with the quality being exceptional.

After plenty of deliberation Alex James awarded first prize to George Evans 51kg Beltex and backed his judgement in buying the Best in Show for 475p/kg for Mr Akram, Pak Mecca Meats. The George King cup for best pen of lambs was retained by Pete Morris whose 40kg Beltex lambs realised 440p/kg purchased by Keith Alderson and Charlie Spencer.

Trade generally throughout the show was satisfactory, John Hughes sold to 360p/kg and the Champion Lamb sold just shy of £250. The commercial trade would be very similar to recent weeks with finished lambs well sold and lean lambs harder work. Richard Morgan's 43kg lambs took top spot at 318p/kg.

The first prize ewes from Stuart Moss sold for £161 for 4 Texels, followed by plenty of smaller or lighter quality ewes at £130 plus. Suffolks sold to £135 for two pens from Ray Lewis and North Country Mules over the £100 mark to £110. Leaner mules £60 to £80, with lean Continentals looking well sold around £100.

Welsh ewes probably a little dearer to £42 for hill ewes and £74 for improved Welsh. Very nice Cheviot ewes to £106 and a poor show of rams to £120 for Charollais. A pair of billy goats sold for £100 each.
