Similar numbers forward with a handful more clean cattle penned. Trade a little easier with a more commercial show of beasts forward. A few leaner sorts were more difficult to sell, whereas well-finished cattle saw competitive bidding.

More steers this morning sold to a high of 332p/kg or £1978 in the lump.

Butchers' heifers did not quite hit the heady heights of last week, but still reached 349p/kg or £1932 for heavier females.

Our bull entry was very mixed, with best continentals in very short supply selling to 270p/kg or £1895 in the lump. Friesians sold to a high of 220p/kg.

One well meated 680kg Limousin cross cow sold to 145p/kg or £986.

20 STEERS SOLD TO OV AV 271P/KG

There were some useful steers about today but with few superstars. Roger Jordin sold his handy 592kg shapey Limmie to 332p/kg or £1965. Other Limmies from the Daltons and the Whiteman stables topped at 284p/kg. Heavier steers sold to £1977.76 for 752kg from Mrs B.

51 HEIFERS SOLD TO OV AV 278P/KG

The Jordin brothers excelled here also selling their best 494kg model to 349p/kg, with another to 340p/kg from the same home. Harvey Parkes took second spot at 347p/kg for 538kg Limousin and his 546kg Limousin selling to 340p/kg. Evans Curdale had a useful run selling 538kg to 338p/kg with others to 336p/kg, 322p/kg, 318p/kg and 316p/kg. Mrs B sold her Belted Galloway cross to 320p/kg for 516kg. Rob Whiteman's 718kg British Blue added up nicely at £1931.42.
